While gualification completion rates can be low, subject pass rates are often high.

System and delivery approaches responsive to learner purpose and goals

High guality, adaptive training delivery

Funding and enrolment practice must support learners to achieve their reason for study.

Targeted support and intervention

Understand learner needs early and provide support from enrolment.

More is needed for those at greatest risk of dropping out.

How do we get there?

Consider opportunities for intervention before, during and after study.

A collaborative approach is needed.

Governments, industry and employers, unions, training providers, learners and influencers all play a part.
